



We have been learning about a variety of concepts in mathematics and the students are showing great progress in their learning. Students showed particularly enjoyment when learning to measure and compare mass using an equal arm balance.





Term 4 already! We have been very busy learning about Cartwright and the Liverpool area. Students have really enjoyed researching information about the communities that have made contributions to this wonderful area.



Throughout the term, students have written a play and performed it in small groups, learnt how different forces move objects and to read the time. (Just to name a few things!)



The students have also been experimenting with some measuring using a range of different equipment such as, measuring ups, thermometers and rulers.



In dance this term, we are learning two dances one hip hop dance and one battle dance. Each week students learn new moves to add onto each dance. By the end of term students will be able to perform two dances confidently.

3/4 Yellow



Wow! Term 4 is already here and it ends in just 5 weeks! I can't believe how the year has flown by and that we are in our final term for 2019. Term 4 is a very exciting and busy term and for many of you this is a special time as your child will be completing their year of schooling.

In Maths 3/4 Yellow students have had many opportunities to gain a deeper understanding of numbers, time and money. The 4 operations; addition, subtraction, multiplication and division will be explored in greater depth as part of our Place Value study.

The students are easily able to identify adjectives and are constantly coming up with new words to include in their narratives. Students are beginning to learn to edit their work so that they are able to identify when words do not look correct and then use their



learnt vocabulary to engage the reader. In History we are learning about the changes in our community. Students had a chance to explore google earth and identify the changes around Liverpool. The most exciting moment was when we discovered the changes that took place in our own school.



Science has also been interesting as we are investigating energy. Students worked in groups to research and present a slide show in regard to different types of energy. We have also carried out a few experiments to explore how sound energy travels.

This term 3/4 Yellow have participated in Dance Fever for sport, where they are learning new skills in Hip Hop and Dance Battle.



3/4 Yellow have continued to work well together in the classroom and I hope to see this fantastic behaviour continuing until the end of the year. The children have been developing skills in learning how to work collaboratively together and what team work looks like.

As this is our last term together I would like to say 'thank you' to all the parents who have provided ongoing support during the year



5 Bronze & 5/6 Silver Night Excursion - Sydney Observatory



Last Thursday the 14th of November, Bronze & 5/6 Silver students returned to school just before dark for our night excursion to the Sydney Observatory.

An Observatory is a building that contains one or more telescopes or other scientific equipment that is used to study space! This excursion linked to last term's study of Space and our place in the Solar System.



The observatory's staff had great experience in stars and space. We learned more about the Solar System. We learnt about planets and dwarf planets. Did you know there are many different names for our Sun? One of the names is 'Sol' which is where the name 'Solar System' comes from.

One of our favourite parts was the North Dome as we got to look at different planets using a giant telescope. The dome has a section open to the night sky but it can rotate to allow astronomers and visitors to look at different areas of the sky.



The planetarium (a domed building that has stars, planets and constellations projected onto the roof) was very cool as well as we were able to observe the different phases of the moon, Mercury and Venus. When



the shadow of the Earth covers the moon, we can only see part of it. This changes every night until we can the whole moon (A full moon) before slowly being hidden again until it cannot be seen (A new moon). Only planets between the Earth and the Sun have phases.

We also used iPads and Artificial Reality (AR) technology to observe and interact with models of other planets.

The students were absolutely exhausted after a very exciting and educational night!




Learning Support


