### **1/2 Orange**

We are in Term 2 of 2021. We had a wonderful start to the term in 1/2 Orange and we are all working towards achieving our goals for this term.

In English we are learning to write to entertain, focusing particularly on physical features and characteristic traits of monsters. Students have enjoyed learning about enhancing their writing through the use of adjectives.

In Maths, our focus is on whole numbers and additive strategies. Students have also been developing their understanding of different methods to use when grouping collections of objects to divide numerals.

In Science we are learning about Bending, Twisting and Mixing. Students have been thrilled to participate in various experiments where we have mixed ingredients and discussed the changes that have occurred. Students have enjoyed posing questions before experimenting and sharing their ideas of what may happen.

This term 1/2 Orange have been participating in a Wellbeing Program every Thursday. Students have thoroughly enjoyed our weekly sessions where they have learnt about balancing, stretching and strengthening our bodies, as well as learning about meditation and mental health.

Each term, students are provided with homework booklets and home readers, that they can change on a weekly basis. This is benefiting students in developing their reading and comprehension of stories.

At CPS we use a Cora stamp chart to reward positive behaviour. Many students in 1/2 Orange have completed their White Cora Chart and will receive a Bronze Award for their efforts. Congratulations to these students for their hard work and positive behaviour in the classroom!

### **4 Purple**

4 Purple has been working extremely hard in class! Here are some things that we would like to share.

#### **Literacy**

We have been learning about descriptive language and narrative. Our mentor text is called Suri's Wall. Suri is lonely behind the walls of a crumbling building that is designed to keep her and the other children safe. A single guard protects them. But for Suri the safe haven is a type of prison: no one speaks to her, a girl who is different – much taller than the others, although they are the same age. She is not part of their night time confidences. But as in all good stories there comes a moment when the world changes for Suri and her difference allows her to give a special gift to her companions: the gift of her imagination.

#### <u>Maths</u>

In Maths, we have been learning about addition and subtraction, length and angles. We have also learnt how to identify fractions and decimals using grid papers and converting fractions to decimals. We are encouraged to learn our 6, 7, 8 and 9 times tables.

#### **History**

During History in Term 2, we were provided an opportunity to study about the diversity and longevity of Australia's first peoples and the ways Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander peoples are connected to Country and Place (land, sea, waterways and skies) and the implications for their daily lives

#### **Science and Technology**

We were given the opportunity to participate in numerous experiments around the Changes of State. We discovered that adding and removing heat can change the state of certain materials.

#### **Creative Arts**

In Term 2, we studied drama and focussed on relationships, tension, time and place. We integrated in our narrative theme when improvising and performing devised and scripted drama.

#### **PDHPE**

In Health, we learnt about empathy, inclusion and respect. We understand that valuing diversity can positively influence respectful relationships.

In Wellbeing sessions, we learnt about mediation and how important it is to have a positive and peaceful mindset.

In Sport, we participated in various sport games and understand the importance of sportsmanship and cooperation.

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge is on! See the above website for more information. All students who complete the Challenge will receive a certificate at the end of the year. Each year the Challenge is completed, students achieve a higher level.

The Challenge must be completed and books logged and entered into the PRC website **by August 20**. There is easy access to do this via the DoE student portal.

**K-2 students must read (or have read to them) 30 books**. 25 of these books must be from the K-2 (or above) NSW PRC booklist and 5 may be any book of their choice. The K-2 Challenge will be completed during class and Library lessons and the books will be logged onto the PRC website for the students.

**Years 3-4 students must read 20 books**. 15 of these books must be from the 3-4 (or above) NSW PRC booklist and 5 may be any book of their choice. Students have a log sheet to record their read books so that they may enter them online.

**Years 5-6 students must read 20 books**. 15 of these books must be from the 5-6 (or above) NSW PRC booklist and 5 may be any book of their choice. Students have a log sheet to record their read books so that they may enter them online.
